## Weekly Round Up

### Equity Markets

- Global equity markets ended higher last week, amid hopes over economic recovery. UK markets ended in positive territory in the last week, after Britain's government announced a support package worth £15.0 billion. On the data front, UK's public sector net borrowing deficit unexpectedly widened in April, while the nation's manufacturing PMI dropped more than expected in May. European markets finished in the green during the week, amid improvement in German business morale. On the macro front, Euro-zone's manufacturing PMI declined more than market forecast in May, while the region's services PMI fell more than estimated in the same month. Separately, Germany's economy grew as expected in the first quarter, while the nation's consumer confidence index slightly improved in June. Also, Germany's manufacturing PMI unexpectedly advanced in May, while the nation's expectations index unexpectedly climbed in May. Meanwhile, Germany's services PMI dropped more than expected in May. US markets closed on a stronger footing in the previous week, after the US FOMC meeting minutes revealed that the central bank would be flexible with interest rate hikes. On the economic front, the US initial jobless claims dropped more than estimated in the week ended 20 May 2022, while the nation's the US Chicago Fed National Activity Index improved in April. On the flipside, the US manufacturing PMI fell more than estimated in May, while the nation's services PMI declined in the same month. Also, the US pending home sales declined to a 2-year low in April. Additionally, the US new home sales dropped to a 2-year low in April, while the nation's durable goods orders rose less than market forecast in April. Further, the US Michigan consumer sentiment index dropped to a 10-year low in May. Asian markets finished mixed during the week.
- In the UK, the FTSE 100 index rose 2.6% to end the week at 7,585.46, while the FTSE 250 advanced 2.7% to close at 20372.52.
- Amongst European markets, the DAX climbed 3.4% to finish the week at 14462.19.
- In the US, DJIA gained 6.2% to end the week at 33,212.96, and the S&P 500 index added 6.6% to end at 4,158.24.

### Currency Markets

- The EUR ended higher against the USD, after European Central Bank President, Christine Lagarde's indicated that the central bank would hike interest rates in July and September.
- The GBP ended higher against the USD, after the British government announced a support package worth £15.0 billion to ease the cost-of-living crisis.
- The USD ended lower against its peers, after the US gross domestic product (GDP) fell more than market forecast in the first quarter of 2022.
- The GBP rose 1.2% against the USD to finish at 1.2631, while the EUR gained 1.6% against the USD to close at 1.0735.

### Gold

- Gold prices rose last week, amid weakness in the US Dollar.
- Gold prices advanced 0.5% to close the week at \$1,857.30/oz.

### Commodities

- Brent oil prices gained last week, amid prospects of a European Union ban on Russian crude imports.
- Brent crude oil prices rose 6.1% to \$119.43/barrel.

### Corporate News and Updates

- Retail sector stocks gained a lot of attention last week. Kingfisher reiterated its annual guidance and announced a share buyback worth £300 million. Peer, Marks & Spencer Group reported an increase in its annual earnings.
- In other corporate news, SSE reported a rise in its full-year pretax profit.

**Legal & General has always been a reliable income stock – but rarely has it been such good value:** It is difficult to justify the absence of certain FTSE 100 stocks from any income portfolio. Their high yields, solid record of dividend payments and diverse business models make them obvious holdings for income-seeking investors. One of the best examples of such a company is Legal & General, which has been a member of Questor's Income Portfolio since the start of 2017. While its capital gain of 5% since then equates to less than 1% a year, its dividend return has been exceptional. Crucially, the insurer continued to make generous payments to shareholders throughout the pandemic. While many other FTSE 100 companies decided to reduce, postpone or even reverse previously announced dividend payments, Legal & General maintained its 2020 financial year dividend at the same level as the previous year despite the challenging operating conditions. Following its decision to maintain its dividend in 2020, L&G then increased its divi by 5% last year and the payment has now risen at an annualised rate of 5.2% over the past five years. Future dividend growth should be supported by the company's range of growth opportunities: it is well positioned to take advantage of long standing and persistent long-term global trends. For example, L&G is seeking to capitalise on a forecast increase in the average life expectancy of the world population by expanding its pension risk transfer business. Pension risk transfer is a type of insurance policy whereby a pension scheme pays a premium to an insurer in return for a guarantee that its members will receive their retirement benefits. In addition, the company's focus on sustainable investment and its status as one of Britain's top 10 housebuilders align it with a wide range of long-term growth trends that are likely to persist in the coming years. However, in Questor's view this threat is more than adequately priced into the company's shares. They have fallen by 13% since the start of the year and now trade on a price-to-earnings ratio of less than 8.

When combined with a yield of more than 7%, the company offers a wide margin of safety for new investors. Legal & General fully deserves its place in our Income Portfolio. But now could represent a particularly opportune moment for anyone who has not yet bought its shares to add them to their own portfolio. The stock's high yield, low valuation, long-term growth drivers and dividend growth potential make it a highly appealing income stock. Questor says, "Buy".
